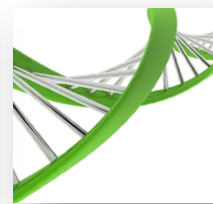




Insecticide Resistance Action Committee

Background

This project started during the IRAC International meetings in Brussels, 2 years ago.

- ❖ U_Neb proposed this work as an element of their Dr. of Plant Health program.
- ❖ The module was to be an interactive training module with supplemental inputs from IRAC. IRAC-US and IRAC International each pledged \$13,500 to support the costs of 2 modules:
 - Principles of Insecticide Resistance (Module 2) and
 - Mechanisms of Insecticide Resistance (Module 3).
- ❖ Considerable delays ...
 - Personnel to work on the project
 - Issues with schedules of principals (Professor Hein and colleagues).
 - Confusion over formats, content, objectives (e.g., audience), etc.
- ❖ Received new version (3) of Module 2 and version 1 of Module 3.
 - [Module 2](#) has some quirks with navigation, but is reasonably complete.
 - [Module 3](#) is in rough draft form, but its content is nearly complete.

Things that need resolution ...

- Professor Hein sent the following questions ...
 - “We have listed IRAC credit on the front page of each module. If IRAC wants this listed in any different manner this can be done to meet your wishes on how this is done.”
 - “These two modules are only meant to address two aspects of resistance and management.”
 - “We are interested in feedback on the materials that are presented so that they can be improved. If the major concerns are to incorporate more animations, etc. this is very expensive and not possible with the budget we had to work with.”
- I am developing a review plan that will of necessity include many IRAC members ...
 - Ask a reviewer to examine one portion of a module.
 - The reviewer will complete a review form.
 - Turnaround time will be 1 to 2 weeks.
